Lamborghini St. Moritz 2010



In a noisy and colourful throng, 100-plus Lamborghinis gathered in Switzerland over the weekend of 18-20 June, welcoming visitors with a boisterous swarm of both classic models and the very latest cars from the House of the Raging Bull.

In a dynamic celebration of the marque, **Lamborghini** owners from around the world, along with Lamborghini dealerships and clubs, flocked to **St. Moritz** to enjoy a driving programme that included a route through the scenic **Julierpass** and **Fluelapass** to **Davos**.

Among the metal-bodied guests of honour was a **Lamborghini Gallardo** police car in its famous blue-and-white livery, provided by the **Polizia di Stato** or **Italian State Police**. It joined the multitude of cars and international guests from **Italy**, **Germany**, **Austria**, **Luxembourg**, **France** and the **UK**, as well as those from further away – such as **India** and **Hong Kong**.










Every current **Lamborghini** model was represented, including the most recently launched **Gallardo LP 570-4 Superleggera** that led the road tour in convoy out of **St. Moritz**. This 'super light' **V10 Gallardo** was first shown at the **Geneva Salon** earlier this year. At 70kg lighter than the already lean **Lamborghini Gallardo LP 560-4**, it claims a 0-62mph time of 3.4 seconds and a top speed of more than 200mph.





Among the classic models was a **Lamborghini Miura SVJ**, in stunning *Rosso Granada*, while a **Lamborghini Jalpa** from the 1980s also attracted admiring attention.









