Later this week, a major car show will finally return to the UK's capital in the form of the London Classic Car Show. Among the exhibits will be 40 automobiles cherry-picked from the finest offerings of the 20th Century...

The 40 classics selected range from the dawn of the motor car (including the earliest <u>Lagonda</u>) right the way through to the relatively modern era, with classics such as the <u>Jaguar XJ220</u> and <u>Bugatti EB110</u> supercars. The event also covers the 'Golden Era' (with a <u>Lancia B24 Spider</u> and the ex-James Coburn Ferrari Cal' Spider) and the Group B era (<u>Audi quattro</u>, <u>Lancia Delta S4</u>, <u>Ferrari 288 GTO</u> and <u>Porsche 959</u>).

Elsewhere, you'll find homages to racing heroes past and present - Sir Stirling Moss, Tazio Nuvolari and Ayrton Senna included - as well as displays dedicated to Le Mans prototypes, Maserati's centenary, and 60 years of the <u>Citroën DS</u>. <u>Eagle E-Types</u> has the largest stand on the show with no fewer than eight cars on display, including the <u>Speedster</u> and <u>Low-Drag GT</u>. Also in attendance will be <u>JD Classics</u>, <u>Nicholas Mee & Co.</u>, <u>Hexagon Classics</u>, <u>Speedmaster</u>, <u>DD Classics</u>, <u>Duncan Hamilton</u>, <u>Graeme Hunt</u>, <u>Joe Macari</u> and <u>Burkhard Wendt Kunsthandel</u>, as well as the retail operations of <u>Silverstone Auctions</u> and <u>Coys</u>. Many of the cars on display will be paraded along the Grand Avenue, the motoring equivalent of the London Fashion Week catwalk.
