Christened the Silver Specter Shooting Brake, this bespoke Rolls-Royce Wraith was designed by Niels van Roij in the Netherlands and constructed by the famous Belgian coachbuilder Carat Duchatelet.



We reckon the vast, V12-powered luxury coupé is very well suited to the traditional shooting brake extension. In fact, the resulting silhouette looks like the work of the factory itself, which is credit to the quality of both Niels van Roij and Carat Duchatelet's work. Said quality is equally impressive in the generous rear hatch, which is lavishly lined with teak decking.
