



Following up on their successful compilation "The Italians", Gestalten's new book "The Americans – Beautiful Machines" features some of the most influential, alluring and surprising cars made in the USA in the last 100 years. Travelling through time from the art deco era to the years of post-war optimism and the decades when surf boards and muscle cars symbolized the America dream. The book celebrates the most emblematic, visionary, and iconic automobiles in the history of United States, and while it worships legends like the Mustang, Gran Torino and Corvette, it also shines a light on the less well known automobiles that still shaped the *zeitgeist* of the 20th Century.



Prodrive: 40 Years of Success


Founded by World Rally Champion David Richards CBE in 1984 with a programme to run a Porsche 959 Group B rally car, Prodrive has become one of the greatest success stories in recent motorsport history. While Prodrive has class wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans and in the FIA World Endurance Championship, the most famous stunt was certainly the Subaru's FIA World Rally Championship programme, with the iconic blue and yellow Imprezas, from 1993–2005, taking three consecutive WRC Manufacturers' titles and three Drivers' titles – for Colin McRae, Richard Burns and Petter Solberg. Written by award-winning author, Ian Wagstaff, "Prodrive: 40 Years of Success" is a celebration of Prodrive's remarkable achievements over four decades of adrenalin-fuelled motorsport action, featuring input from those who have been a part of the story.



JaguarSport XJR-15

Ask your car buddies for their favourite 1990s supercar and they will most likely name the McLaren F1, Porsche 911 GT1, Mercedes-Benz CLK GTR or Bugatti EB110. Meanwhile, time seems to have forgotten about one of the most ambitious and exciting cars of the decade – the sensational, V12-engined JaguarSport XJR-15. In this personal history, the car's designer Peter Stevens offers an entertaining and insightful reminder of exactly what made it so special at its launch in 1990, and why this exceedingly rare car has become one of the world's most sought-after classics.




De Tomaso. Rise and Fall




Das wertvollste Auto der Welt


