Bonhams at the Goodwood Festival of Speed 11th July 2008 -Review



As expected, the 1955 Jaguar D-type 'XKD509' was top-seller at the Goodwood sale, achieving a world record (for the marque at auction) of £2,201,500. Other cars finding new owners included the ultra-rare 1970 Monteverdi 375/S High Speed Coupé Series II, just one car from the Alexander Fyshe Collection, selling for £89,500.



The Jaguar sold to a British buyer, as did **'R1A'** – the first prototype **ERA** – going to a private UK collector in the saleroom for £359,000. **Goodwood**, a **Jaguar D-type** and an **ERA**? You can't get much more British than that.

However, the **1937 Lagonda LG45 Rapide** (estimated at £350,000 – 400,000) was a non-seller, sadly failing to complete the home-grown, quality 'triple'. We tipped another British classic, the **1959 AC Ace-Bristol Roadster**, in our preview and it produced the goods: selling for £106,000. Another significant car finding a new owner was the **1930 Invicta 4½-litre S-Type Tourer 'Scimitar'** achieving £419,500 – at the high end of estimate, but a typical price for these modish, powerful pre-War sports cars.

The 1962 Mercedes-Benz 190SL Convertible with Factory Hardtop, a one-owner car from new, was a

nice entry and sold for a fair bit over estimate at £29,900, while £155,500 for the **2005 Mercedes-Benz SLR McLaren Coupé** shows what depreciation can do to new cars, easily available pre-owned.

Of the **Astons**, the **1963 DB5 to Vantage Specification** went nicely for £144,500, as did the **1955 DB2/4 Drophead Coupé** (£124,700). Bonhams did well with the club racing **1961 DB4** – never easy cars to sell, and £87,300 was just the right price.

One of the 'big-hitters', the **1939 Bugatti Type 57 3.3-litre 'Atalante' Coupé** didn't sell, nor did the **1968 Bizzarrini GT Strada 5300 Coupé** (estimated at £200,000 - 250,000). Italian cars that did included the aforementioned **Monteverdi**, the **1972 Maserati Bora 4.7-litre Coupé** (for a mid-estimate £40,000), and the quite superb Lime Green **1970 Lamborghini Miura P400S Series II**, for £243,500.
