## RM sells 'Blancpain' Gallardo racer in Monaco, raising 155,000 euros for charity

The 605bhp car, built by the Lamborghini Motorsport Department and Reiter Engineering to international GT3 regulations, was Blancpain President and CEO Marc A. Hayek's mount in 2011 when he and Dutchman Peter Kox won the Amateur Class in the ADAC/Masters Championship.

The fund-raising project was a cooperation between luxury watchmaker Blancpain, Canadian auction house RM Auctions and Classic Driver.
