Reportedly now in 'safe and reliable' driving condition, some of the cosmetic details are truly remarkable: the body number that was applied to the bulkhead in chalk when it left the factory, still boldly emblazoned, and the 'California State University of Long Beach' sticker, applied by a previous owner, for example.
