How cool are these vintage Omegas from Antiquorum?

The catalogues for Antiquorum's watch auctions always prove popular with the editorial team here at Classic Driver, thanks to the variety of exciting, unusual and often affordable timepieces on offer. These are the watches for which we wouldn't think twice about raising our paddle...

If you're in the market to spend several hundred thousand Swiss francs on a watch, you're also well catered for at <u>Antiquorum's sale in Geneva, taking place on 8 November 2015</u> – both the <u>skull tourbillon Richard Mille</u> (est. 340,000-420,000 Swiss francs) or the <u>astronomy-inspired Patek Philippe</u> (300,000-350,000 francs) should appeal. But the watches at the lower end of the catalogue are just as interesting, especially the rare vintage Omega chronographs. All 1970 models, the <u>Seamaster Soccer Timer</u> was originally sold to Mozambique, the <u>Seamaster Bullhead</u> to Columbia, and the <u>Speedmaster Mark II Racing</u> to Norway. Temptingly, all three are estimated under 5,000 francs. There are some beautiful pieces from other watchmakers, too, such as the <u>simple military IWC from 1952</u>, estimated to fetch 3,000-5,000 francs.
