The new Pelagos LHD (Left-Hand Drive) is said to take inspiration from the reference 9401, which was built for the French Navy in the early-1980s. In addition to utilising Tudor's new in-house movement, each watch is individually numbered on the caseback, perhaps indicating that the Swiss watchmaker doesn't intend to build a lot of these timepieces? If that's the case, we recommend heading to your nearest authorised dealer to secure one of the 4,400-dollar titanium divers as soon as possible.
