While leaving their opening location of Beaune, some competitors were already running into some mechanical issues with their classic cars. Thankfully, the spirit of Tour Auto ensures that despite being competitors, the sportsmanship is stronger than ever, and no team is left stranded!

One team we kept a close eye on were friends of Classic Driver, Gaby von Oppenheim and Quirina Louwman, who have chosen a stunning 2-litre Porsche 911 as their steed for this notoriously tricky adventure.
