This example has covered a mere 28,889 miles, making it a prime example of the breed, so if you've been longing for Maserati's 1990s halo car like us, then don't hesitate to add this example to your collection!

# **Black Adder**

We're used to seeing the Dodge Viper in various patriotic shades of red, white, and blue, but this manual 1995 Viper RT/10 Roadster has us convinced that black is the prime choice for this American supercar.
